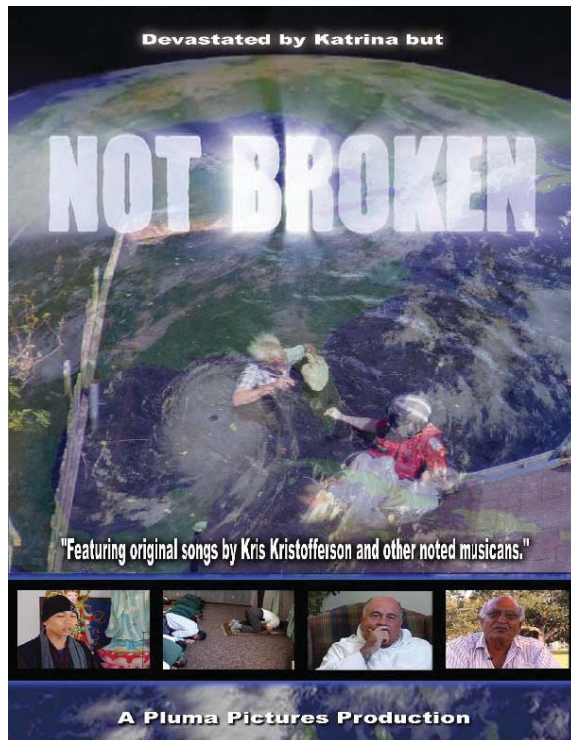


Festivals & New Orleans Premiere—



‘Not Broken’ Going to Denmark

Our feature documentary about the Katrina disaster, *Not Broken*, has been selected and nominated for awards at three film festivals, including one international event, and to premiere in New Orleans in commemoration of Earth Day, April 22nd.



Not Broken was selected to screen and is a finalist for best Debut Feature Film at the *AFIA Film Festival* in Aarhus, Denmark, March 12 -17.

In addition, *The Ashé Cultural Art Center* invited Pluma Pictures to premiere the feature documentary in *The Big Easy*. *Not Broken* is the only film to be screened on *Earth Day* at 6 p.m. in the cultural art center, located at 1712 Oretha Castle Haley Blvd., 70113.

Music and poetry are integral to the documentary, produced and directed by Armando P. Ibáñez. A song by Kris Kristofferson and another by noted folksinger John Flynn play pivotal roles in the mesmerizing music score. “Michael Paz, our music producer and supervisor, did an outstanding job in helping us make music a critical player in the documentary,” said Ibáñez. Also, included in the powerful soundtrack are songs and music by other noted singers and musicians including, the late Jack Neilson, Anders Osborne, Joshua Maurice Ragsdale and Theresa Andersson. Other musicians include rising Gospel music composer Stephen Lee, Chris Stroffolino and Paul Soniat. Todd Schmidt and Ned Greene are co-producers, Pascal Leister editor, and John Polito, sound mix.
