

This is especially true of the Isle of Iona, known today as a "spiritual hot spot" and the focus of extraordinary spiritual activity.

This pilgrimage offers the experience of contemplative prayer and reflection within a spirit of community, learning & discovery – truly an experience of participants as pilgrims on a journey. Our tour will also highlight cathedrals, castles, pageantry, drama, good food and fellowship, and even the English language (though somewhat different from our own). What more could you ask? YOUR DAY-TO-DAY ITINERARY

SUN, OCT 21 - CHICAGO/ACROSS THE ATLANTIC

Depart Chicago today on board your overnight transatlantic jet flight.

MON, OCT 22 - ARRIVE LONDON

Arrive London. The remainder of the day is at leisure. (B)

TUE, OCT 23 - LONDON/CAMBRIDGE

Your morning tour of London's West End takes you first to Trafalgar Square, dominated by Nelson's Column. Proceed along the Thames Embankment past Big Ben, the Houses of Parliament and Westminster Abbey, burial place of many of England's most famous men and women. Continue up Whitehall and the Mall to Buckingham Palace for the Changing of the guard. The return journey is through London's Royal Parks.

This afternoon drive to Cambridge to visit its historic University and Colleges. Visit the magnificent King's College and Chapel and Trinity College's Wren-designed library. Then walk along "The Backs" (grassy slopes behind the colleges) along the River Cam for some wonderful views of the medieval buildings. Famous alumni of Cambridge include Wordsworth, Newton, Tennyson, Darwin and Prince Charles. (B,D)

WED, OCT 24 - CAMBRIDGE/NORWICH/YORK

This morning depart for Norwich, home of one of the most important English mystics, Julian of Norwich. In 1372, at the age of 30, suffering from a severe illness and believing she was on her deathbed, Julian had a series of intense visions of Jesus Christ. These visions are the source of her major work called *Sixteen Revelations of Divine Love*. Visit St. Julian's Church and Shrine. Then continue north to the ancient city of York. (B,D)

THU, OCT 25 – YORK/DURHAM/ NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE

This morning enjoy a tour of this storybook town of cobbled streets and curious shops. Visit York Minster with its stained glass windows and stroll along the Shambles, the narrow zigzag of shopping streets that have survived since the Middle Ages. Continue to Durham to visit the 11th century Durham

Cathedral, regarded as one of the finest examples of Norman architecture. It houses the shrine of St. Cuthbert of Lindisfarne, the North's best-loved saint. After your visit, drive to the Newcastle Upon Tyne area for overnight.

FRI, OCT 26 - NEWCASTLE UPON TYNE/ LINDISFARNE/EDINBURGH

This morning drive to Lindisfarne, known as the Holy Island. In 635 AD, St. Aidan came from Iona to introduce Christianity into northeast England and founded his monastery on Lindisfarne. Since then it has become a center of pilgrimage. This morning visit the Priory and Castle. Cross the border into Scotland. Drive through the history-steeped Lowland Hills to Edinburgh, the capital of Scotland. This afternoon set out to see Edinburgh, Princes Street and the Royal Mile with the Scott Monument. History comes alive as you tour the mighty Edinburgh Castle. See Greyfriars Church and the Grass Market and explore Princes Street. (B.D)

SAT, OCT 27 - EDINBURGH/OBAN/MULL/IONA

Depart Edinburgh this morning and drive west across Scotland following the shore of Loch Lomond to Oban, a seaport on the firth of Lorn. Take the ferry from Oban to the Isle of Mull, then on to the Isle of Iona, where many Scottish kings lie buried. St. Columba and his disciples landed here from Ireland in 563 AD and established Scotland's first Christian monastic settlement, resulting in the extension of Christianity throughout Scotland and Europe. Today it serves primarily as a religious retreat center.

SUN, OCT 28 & MON, OCT 29 - IONA

These two days are reserved for your retreat on the beautiful and serene Isle of Iona.

TUE, OCT 30 - IONA/GLASGOW

Depart Iona today by ferry to the Isle of Mull and continue by ferry back to Oban. Travel south to Glasgow, Scotland's largest city founded by St. Mungo in AD550. Upon arrival, enjoy an orientation tour of the city. (B)

WED, OCT 31 - GLASGOW/CHICAGO

Your adventure is over as you fly back to Chicago, arriving the same day.

THE TOUR PRICE INCLUDES:

AIR TRANSPORTATION: By any IATA/ARC air carrier or other scheduled jet carrier, in economy class, with flights and air routings at the discretion of the air carriers and Nawas and based on non-refundable bulk group fares. Cancellations made after air tickets have been issued are subject to full cancellation penalties as imposed by the airlines. SURFACE TRANSPORTATION: By deluxe motorcoach.

FLIGHT INSURANCE: Automatic one hundred thousand dollars flight insurance policy for each Nawas-ticketed passenger, subject to policy terms and limitations.

DEVIATIONS: All deviation requests from the group itinerary must be received at Nawas in writing no later than 100 days prior to departure. A \$100 non refundable fee per person will be charged on all deviations in addition to any extra airfare that may be incurred.
